ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Major Course

A student will be allowed to take admission in the Major Course of B.A./B.Sc. if he/she/transgender *has passed in at least four (04) subjects with English as compulsory subject* in the Higher Secondary [10+2] Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other Examination which is recognized by the University as equivalent thereto.

General Criteria

- It may be noted that in matter of eligibility 49.5% and above shall be equal to 50%; 54.5% and above shall be equal to 55%; and 59.5% marks and above shall be equal to 60%.
- With regard to SC/ST candidates, the minimum marks of eligibility shall be as per rules of the State Government. An SC/ST candidate getting admission should have obtained in the previous examination, qualifying marks not lower by more than 25% of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category.
- 3 With regard to OBC-A/OBC-B candidates, the minimum marks of eligibility shall be as per rules of the State Government. An OBC-A/OBC-B candidate getting admission should have obtained in the previous examination, qualifying marks not lower by more than 10% of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category.
- 4 As per the rules of the State Government SC/ST candidates migrating from other states will be treated as general candidates.
- For admission to the Under Graduate Course there should not be a gap of more than 3 years between the year of Higher Secondary Examination and the year of admission to Under Graduate Course of study. (Students passing H.S. in the years 2021, 2022, and 2023 are eligible.)
- 6 Candidates may note that the admission to any Course is provisional. If a candidate fails to fulfill the eligibility criteria laid down by the University of North Bengal, the admission shall stand cancelled at any stage.
- 7 Those students who have credentials in sports and games shall be given due weightage in the admission to UG Courses. Those sports and games shall be considered for weightage which are affiliated to Sports Board, University of North Bengal.
 - 7.i The following sports and games shall be considered for weightage:

i.a Athletics (Men and Women) i.f Kho-Kho (Men and Women)

i.b Badminton (Men and Women) i.g Kabaddi (Men and women)

i.C Cricket (Men) i.h Table Tennis (Men and women)

i.d Football (Men) i.i Volleyball (Men)

i.e Handball (Men and Women)

- 7.ii The categories of students who shall be considered for such weightage are as follows:
 - ii.a Position Holder at State Level Competition;
 - ii.b Participation at National level Competition;
 - ii.C Position Holder at National Level Competition;
 - ii.d Participation at International level Competition; and
 - ii.e Position Holder at International level Competition.

NOTE: Weightage shall be given to students if he/she has participated or held position at International Level Competition in any games and sports.

Important Note

- For candidates under the SC/ST/OBC category, SC/ST/OBC certificates (valid for West Bengal) must be obtained from the competent authority in the name of the candidate.
- For candidates under the EWS category, Income and Asset Certificate must be obtained from the competent authority for the current financial year (2023-24) in the name of the candidate.
- For candidates under the Permanent Disabled Reserved Category, Permanent Disability Certificate must be obtained from the Civil Surgeon/District Medical Officer.
- Attested copies of Certificates are required to be produced at the time of admission.
- At the time of enrolment, a candidate has to submit two copies of recent unattested stamp size (4.6 cm x 4.6 cm) photographs and the original Mark-sheet.
- Candidates from boards other than WBCHSE (any examining body outside the West Bengal) must submit a Migration Certificate from the competent authority.
- All subsequent Notifications, Counselling Schedules, Admission Instructions, Merit Panel, etc. will be uploaded on the College Website and put up in the College Notice Board.
- Contact Office of the Principal for any further query, such as, admission on transfer, method of computation of SGPA & CGPA, rules regarding reassessment & scrutiny, disciplinary rules during examination, provisional result & Grade Card, etc.

For a Major course, where student has not studied the subject at X+2 level -

Merit = [Marks obtained in English + Best marks obtained in other three subjects] / 4
